Bodie State Park - September 15, 16 and 17

On Saturday, September 16, we will meet at Bodie State Park for a day of dawn to dusk photography at Bodie's **Photographers' Day**. As of August 25 there was plenty of space available to take part in this event (read below). You can still make reservations by calling ahead. Ask if you can pay at the gate, I have been told that you can do it at the time of entry. For those who have reservations the gate will open at 6:10 AM and close at 7:35 PM (sunrise is at 6:39 AM). For those who have not paid, the regular park hours are 9:00 AM to 4:00PM. We will meet at 11:30 AM in the parking area for lunch. This will allow everyone to begin taking pictures as soon as they arrive. There is no concession at the park so bring your own lunch and drinks.

On Friday, September 15, Marni and I will be photographing sunrise at the South Tufa Area at Mono Lake if you would like to join us. Photographers' Days: Friends of Bodie hosts Photographers' Days once each month during the summer. Each session is held on the 3rd Saturday of each month starting in May and ending in October. At that session photographers are allowed to enter the park 30 minutes before sunrise and stay until 30 minutes after sunset. Limited to 50 people per day. Cost is \$30 (\$20 for FOB members). Reservations are required

Eddie Soloway's photographs are the expression of his passion and fascination with the natural world. His major work has been divided between representational presentations of wilderness moments – where the essence of the place is of utmost importance, to the celebrations of the abstract – where he distills the shape, color, and light in many forested communities. Additional works include photogravures celebrating a sense of place, and a whimsical series of images created "On The Road."

His eye has evolved during years of exploring the earth's wild places. He spent ten years working for the Institute for Earth Education, where he helped develop wilderness journeys and school curricula and conducted educational workshops in five countries. His technical skills were honed working at a Bay Area custom photographic lab that specialized in the now historic dye transfer process. In 1998 Eddie was the first recipient of the Excellence in Photographic Teaching Award presented by the Santa Fe Center for Photographic Arts. Today he divides his time between making fine prints, teaching week long workshops at leading photographic schools around the world, and creating stock images for Getty Images. His book of images and essays, One Thousand Moons, was released in 2004. An impassioned teacher, Eddie brings experience in both nature and photography to his popular workshops and seminars.
