

Competition: It's Not About Winning Jerry Meshulam - Competition Chair

What's that supposed to mean? Isn't that the point of a competition? In my opinion, no. Sure, getting ribbons and plaques can be rewarding, but I see our competitions more importantly as all about personal challenge and development. We are competing against ourselves, not other members in the club. Positive comments from a judge may indicate that you have succeeded in meeting your personal challenge with a particular image, even if it doesn't win a ribbon. That is one reason why it is so important to participate in the competitions. As active members of SRPS we are interested in learning from each other, improving our artistic skill in photography and enjoying the wonderful camaraderie.

There's no better way to know how well you're doing than to show your work for others to view and to hear a judge's critique. The silence in the room means you don't get to explain to the judge how you arose at 3:00 a.m., froze your fingers and crawled through barbed wire to get the shot, then worked for 10 hours at your computer to perfect it. The image speaks for itself. Did you succeed in presenting your subject in a fresh way? Were there techniques you used, or could have used? Was the image positively recognized? Did you learn something from the evening's critiques that inspires you toward excellence for your next month's entries?

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Advancing through the club's levels is about challenging yourself to create exciting photographic art every month and then entering it on a consistent basis. Advancement through the levels is based on points. In fact, placing in the top three during a monthly competition has no added advantage in advancing to the next level.

Although one way to achieve a requirement for reaching Masters is to win an end-of-year competition, it's not mandatory. Theoretically, you can reach the Master's level without ever winning a single club competition. However, it's unlikely because as you become proficient you will be creating images that are recognized by judges for their outstanding artistic qualities.

Many in the club have promoted salons that allow for extended discussion and improve the quality of feedback. I agree and encourage everyone to support the salons by participating with your comments and entries, but the salons are limited to a select number of images. At the monthly competitions you will have up to two of your images viewed and scored, most often with helpful suggestions. It's the time to show your best work, put yourself out there and see how others respond. Join the competition, join the fun, grow your excellence and delight in your personal rewards.
