# Exhibiting Your Photography by Sharon Feissel

That first step into exhibiting your photography outside of your close circle or beyond the photo club can be somewhat daunting. My own silent prayer has always been: "Please, just don't let me embarrass myself too badly." To minimize personal embarrassment and maximize personal success, let me suggest the following:

1. <u>Selecting your entries</u>. Be very discerning in looking at the quality of your *photograph*, as well as of the *print* itself. Remember that it is not the *best* but the *worst* image you present that tells the viewer (judge/potential buyer) what you consider to be superior work. Set your standards high, so your cumulative reputation will be high.

You are the initial juror. The hardest skill to acquire is to look objectively at your own work. At the beginning, you might find it helpful to list all the things you have learned that make an image weak or strong and use that as a checklist for evaluating each potential exhibition image.

2. Where to get started. The easiest first step is the Sonoma County Fair, the Sonoma-Marin Fair, and the Harvest Fair and, in Napa County, the Mustard Festival and Napa County Fair. The fairs are broadly accepting of work at all levels. There is good experience to be gained in learning to follow venue requirements, seeing how your own work looks in comparison to the rest of the exhibition, and testing the waters as far as gaining awards. This is where we all got started. You gain experience and confidence in these settings. And the cost is minimal.

Try Sebastopol Center for the Arts, Plaza Arts in Healdsburg, Artisans Art Gallery in San Rafael, Gualala Arts in Gualala. The Marin Fair is very competitive. Just getting into the Marin Fair is confirmation of your work.

- 3. Approaching venues. You may want to approach galleries, frame shops, wineries, restaurants, and other places that exhibit artwork, including the city of Santa Rosa. You will have to be certain that you can provide not just an image or two but a body of quality work to fill the space available. You will need a well-selected portfolio—remember that the portfolio is your "exhibition on paper." It shows people what could be on their walls. A nice binder with your best images in clear sleeves will serve for this purpose. Since there aren't many venues, the waiting list can be a year or more.
- 4. <u>Costs and pricing</u>. A real tough one. Just accept the fact that you probably will not have massive sales, and you will not cover all your photography costs. Costs per image include not only paper, inks, test prints, matting, frame, and glass, but also the entry fee and commission that will be subtracted from a sale. So be certain that these things are covered in your price, and add a bit for yourself.
