I believe club members will find "Mountain Light" available for check out from the club library. I hope you find these tidbits enjoyable and useful.

From Mountain Light: "Ordering a performance of light waves for the public eye is much like ordering a performance of sound waves for the public ear. Many photographers of the natural world, including such greats as Ansel Adams and Ernst Hass, emerged from strong musical backgrounds."

Think about how the elements in your image all fit together, and watch out for those dissonant elements that have the visual effect of a wrong note in symphony.

Open deadline: SHOWCASE 2008. Plaza Arts Center is now taking applications for the Showcase 2008 season. Showcase exhibits are juried and run for a period of four weeks - including weekends, a reception and promotional postcards. Each artist is allocated 8 linear feet of display space except for the January Showcase which allocates 12 linear feet. All media are considered. The fee is \$125 for a 4-week event. 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Expanding on the same idea Rowell states: "An intriguing method for creating awareness of how much normal perception is oversimplified has been used to jump start advanced art students into an understandingt of fine art photography. A telltale exercise asks them to walk around, discover a photograph they would like to make, and draw a sketch of their vision before taking out their cameras. Invariably, the sketches these students create are clean, simple, bold, pleasing, and easily comprehensible compared to the cluttered photographs that later result from their failure to comprehend the unconscious inferences their brains have made in interpreting and simplifying the scene. They learn that the images they hold in their minds -- both from direct observation and their imagination -- need translation to come across in photographs."

"Our best pictures show a less 'busy" world than we experienced, a world that bears an uncanny resemblance to the sentimental one held in the mind's eye that was first simplified though normal visual processing and further idealized through the golden sieve of memory."


