Greg Gorsiski:

Nice. Here's a tip when using texture.

Texture on a canvas is UNDER the paint, not over. So in areas of heavy paint, or main focus, would have less texture because you applied more layers of paint.

You can simulate that with a simple mask. I don't have this image plain, so I'll use your other flower image.

I used Color Range Select tool, and click on the yellow main flower and turned up the fuzziness


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


I duplicated your layer and converted this selection to a layer mask. I also inverted it so the yellow is PROTECTED or MASKED out. Black=hides.





I applied a Texturizer - Canvas texture to the pixels



Then added the selection I made above as a layer mask

Notice the heavy texture fades out where it's black. The flower is more preserved from the texture and becomes more realistic. The yellow flower now looks like it has more paint covering the texture of the lighter paint under it.

Study the flower and see where the 'canvas' peeks through here and there based on its luminosity (color range selection). Notice in the background flowers, the yellow has lighter texture. The brain feels this, and knows it's there, it becomes less of an 'effect' and more reality.

Notice in my layers, I backed off the texture layer 20%. This lightened the effect slightly, easier to control the scale of the texturizer window. If you tried this on your sandals, the purples might POP more having slightly less texture that the background.

One other thing to keep in mind. I think you used Burlap. No artists paint on burlap. Sandstone or canvas is more realistic. Plus use a lower scale, I'm usually around 50% with a relief of something like 1-2.
